DON BECKER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Don Becker was a 1958 graduate of Cunningham High School and was very sports-minded. He was a big supporter of all athletes. He was well-known to talk with players about their game. His family presents this scholarship in his memory.

BRADLEY SCHOLARSHIP

The Bradley Scholarship is given to honor the memory of William A. Bradley and his son William E. Bradley, editor and publishers of the now historic newspaper The Cunningham Clipper, Laverna Nossaman Bradley, who proofread every work, and Arlene Bradley, teacher and musician.

CLASS OF 1955 SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established as a gift from the CHS Class of 1955 on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of its graduation. CRICK FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

The Jack and Eileen Crick Family Scholarship was established in 2018. Jack and Eileen Crick moved to Cunningham in 1960 and are proud supporters of the community and school. Jack served his country in the Navy from 1952 to 1956 and in the reserves until 1978. Jack was a local mail carrier and served on the school board for 23 years. Eileen is a registered nurse and was the person everyone called before Cunningham had EMT's. Their scholarship is given to extend financial support to a worthy student/s.

CUNNINGHAM ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP

The Cunningham Alumni Scholarship was established after the last Cunningham High School Reunion by the banquet committee. Consideration is given to the class valedictorian, and to students who have strong ties to the area and may make meaningful long-term contributions to the community.

Dale DeWeese graduated from CHS in 1960. He was a farmer, stockman, and Cunningham Community/school supporter. This scholarship is given in his memory by his family.

ANN FEWIN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Ann Hauser Fewin, born in 1933, was raised in Cunningham, Kansas, where she graduated from Cunningham High School. She went on to attend Wichita State University, earning a degree in Elementary Education with a minor in Music. This scholarship, established in her memory by her family, supports a student pursuing an education degree, honoring her lifelong commitment to learning and teaching.

KENNY AND MARILYN GLENN FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

The Glenn Family Scholarship is given to honor the Elmer and Elva Glenn family. Elmer attended CHS and served on a rural school board. Elva was a cook at the school for seventeen years. They put a high value on education and all five of their children graduated from CHS and went on to higher education. Their youngest son, Kenneth Glenn, served 22 years on the school board.

KEVIN HUFFMAN SCHOLARSHIP

Kevin Huffman was a lifelong resident of Cunningham, graduating in 1979 from CHS where he played football, basketball, track and occasionally studied. He loved his community and the school system, choosing to return to farm, run his accounting business and serve on the USD 332 Board of Education. BOB AND JEANETTE KERSCHEN SCHOLARSHIP

WARREN MEIREIS FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Warren Meireis grew up on a farm in Preston, KS and graduated from Preston High School in 1957. He attended Southwestern College in Winfield with a degree in Education. His first teaching position was in Frankfort, KS. The five years he was there he enjoyed teaching, coaching, fishing and golf. He moved to Plainville in 1966. At the end of his time there, he was acting principal but his love for kids caused him to move to Cunningham High School in 1977, where he was the business teacher, coach (all sports), athletic director, and referee. This scholarship was established as a memorial by his family.

JACK AND JANE MEYERS FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Jack and Jane Meyers spent their entire married lives in the Cunningham community, and over the years have volunteered countless hours in countless ways, always for the betterment of this town they call home. DEE MILLS SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in memory of Dee Mills. She was City Clerk for the City of Cunningham, secretary to the Supt. of Schools, and Clerk of the Board of Education for many years.

DENNIS RANEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Dennis Raney was a graduate of CHS and a lifetime resident of Cunningham. He served his country in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War. Dennis was active in the American Legion and participated in parades and Memorial Day services. He was a sales representative for Southwest Truck in Pratt for 30 years. This scholarship is given in his memory by his family.

ALVIN J. ROHR SCHOLARSHIP

The Alvin J. Rohr Scholarship was established by Mr. Rohr and his family. Mr. Rohr was a Math and Science teacher in the Cunningham Schools for many years. Since his passing, the Alvin J. Rohr Scholarship is given by his family in his memory.
